# Community Involvement

To interact with residents, we:

- Hold regular advice surgeries every Saturday 11am –12 noon at Sneinton Library and the 1st and 3rd Saturday of every month 10am - 11am at Bakersfield Library
- Undertake monthly Councillor ward walks with partner services (e.g. Police, Community Protection and Street Scene) where residents have the opportunity to raise any neighbourhood issues
- Hold 12 Local issues meetings in the year at various locations across the ward including BANCA, MCO, Greenway, URC, etc.
- Hold residents meetings with groups such as Sneinton Tenants & Residents Association (STARA), Friends of Colwick Woods, Carlton Folds and Candle Meadow
- Hold monthly Neighbourhood Action Team (NAT) meetings which also highlight issues affecting residents and we hold service providers accountable

## Ward Work and Achievements

- This year we have continued to improve children's parks to make them a safe and enjoyable place to be. We improved Tricket's Yard play area behind the Greenway Centre by cutting back vegetation, installing new equipment and making it a better space for young and old to enjoy
- To tackle the issue of parking outside Nottingham Academy, funds were allocated and parking restrictions have now been put in place. Vehicles are no longer allowed to park outside Nottingham Academy between 12-2pm, there has been an extension of zig-zags outside the entrance and double yellow lines have been extended also
- To tackle the issue of fly tipping across the ward, we are looking at investing into a 3g portable camera which can be transported between the hotspots
- By replacing broken locks on resident's alleyways, we have reduced the number of ASB and fly tipping in these areas
- As a NAT priority, it was agreed that there be increased Police patrols to tackle the issue of ASB outside the shop Boozebusters on Oakdale road
- We have pruned nuisance and overgrown trees which were causing damage to properties and trouble to residents
- We have enforced the Dog Control Order so that dogs remain on leads, therefore owners will be held accountable for any dog fouling and fines have been issued

### **Area Capital Funds**

We used our allocated funding for Local Transport Plans (LTP) schemes and Public Realm schemes.

- Local Transport Plans (LTP) schemes £63,441 was used for: resurfacing Pullman Road footpath, lining outside Nottingham Academy, dropped crossings, Colwick Road Carriageway, feasibility study of Candle Meadow and introduction of scheme to address parking issues on Lord Street, Robert Street and Windmill Lane
- Public Realm schemes £48,045 was used for: Watson Avenue/ Bentley Avenue signage & Traffic Regulation Order (TRO), Dales ward bins, Greens Mill Play area, Rossington Road ASB in alleyway, Gate lock replacements, 3 year program to tackle nuisance trees, area improvements

- 1. We will continue to hold weekly advice surgeries/ monthly meetings for residents and respond promptly to constituent emails and phone calls
- 2. We will bring in further measures to tackle speeding in Bakersfield
- 3. We will continue to work with enforcement staff to tackle fly tipping and irresponsible dog owners, keeping our streets as clean as possible
- 4. We will open a new "JOINT SERVICE CENTRE" including a new library and retaining the police neighbourhood team in Dales Ward
