Parking Regulation and Compliance Community Protection Commercial and Operations PN-170

We will use the relevant footage (both video and voice recording) provided by the BWVC as evidence to ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of staff and to manage any citizen complaints. The camera is only activated by the officer wearing the camera in the event that an incident is anticipated. The basis under which the Council uses personal data for this purpose is that this is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the Council or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Council.

You are not obliged by statute to provide the information; however, the footage relevant to you will be captured by the officer if they anticipate an incident. The video footage be kept for a maximum period of 1 year from the date of the capture, and will only be retained if the footage is downloaded as part of a criminal investigation, accident or complaint.

The new data protection law known as the General Data Protection Regulation provides for the following rights as prescribed by the legislation:

- A right to request a copy of your information
- A right to request rectification of inaccurate personal data
- A right to request erasure of your data known as 'the right to be forgotten'
- A right to in certain circumstances to request restriction of processing
- A right in certain circumstances to request portability of your data to another provider
- A right to object to processing of data in certain circumstances

• A right regarding automated decision making including profiling
