

## **Information on Educational Psychologists for children**



## What is an Educational Psychologist?

An Educational Psychologist helps children who are finding school difficult. Sometimes they help children and sometimes they help the teachers.

## Who do Educational Psychologists visit?

Educational Psychologists meet lots of different people, from very young children, to adults. There are lots of reasons why they might be asked to help. Educational Psychologists help children with the bits of school that they find difficult.



## Where do they visit people?

Educational Psychologists usually meet children in school, but sometimes can visit them at home.

## What does the Educational Psychologist do?

They do lots of different things. They may watch a lesson or talk to you about how things are for you or what you like and don't like. Depending on what you are finding difficult, they may want to you to try some activities and puzzles. The Educational Psychologist will also talk to the adults who know you best to find ways to help you.
