

Public Space Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) Evaluation - 1st January to 31st December 2024

Description of the Scheme and the Geographical Area(s) of Operation

Public space CCTV provision is an effective tool available to local authorities and their partnerships to address crime, anti-social behaviour and improve security. Local authorities as responsible authorities under the provisions of the Crime and Disorder Act 1998 (and as amended) have a responsibility, not only to develop community safety plans but also to consider the impact of all their policies on crime, anti-social behaviour, substance misuse and reoffending.

Nottingham City Council provides a comprehensive range of services across the public safety spectrum, which include Community Protection enforcement, housing enforcement, licensing and cleansing. The Nottingham Control Centre based at Woodlands in Radford manages the public space cameras of Nottingham City Council. There are 303 public space cameras covering Nottingham City; 289 of these are monitored continuously with operatives in direct communication with Nottinghamshire Police. The remaining 14 CCTV Cameras require the operator to dial into the camera to view and airtime is used to be able to undertake live viewings. All cameras are recording 24/7 for the required 31 days.

Under the Surveillance Camera Commissioner: Code of Practice¹ it is a requirement that:

- Surveillance camera system images and information should be subject to appropriate security measures to safeguard against unauthorised access and use.
- There should be effective review and audit mechanisms to ensure legal requirements, policies and standards are complied with in practice, and regular reports should be published.
- When the use of a surveillance camera system is in pursuit of a legitimate aim, and there is a pressing need for its use, it should then be used in the most effective way to support public safety and law enforcement with the aim of processing images and information of evidential value.
- Any information used to support a surveillance camera system which compares against a reference database for matching purposes should be accurate and kept up to date.

The Control Centre within the Woodlands meets all of the requirements above, which are annually audited as part of holding the following accreditations and compliances:

- BS 7958:2015 Code of Practice for the Management and Operation of CCTV
- ISO 9001: 2015
- BS 7858 Security Vetting
- BS 5979 – Alarm Receiving Centre
- Fully compliant with Surveillance Camera Code of Practice (2013)

There are two configurations to the public space CCTV:

1. *Permanently installed cameras* - which are hard wired into a leased analogue/fibre provider (such as BT, Virgin)
2. SIM technology to transmit images back to the operator using data allowance

The 4G Redeployable cameras managed by the CCTV control room, which are placed for short-term solutions in response to ward or police requests.

The Objective and Scope of the Scheme:

The following purposes have been established and notification has been registered with the Information Commissioner for the Nottingham City CCTV and associated systems:

Initiatives under the crime & disorder act including participation in crime reduction partnerships, serving of anti-social behaviour orders etc.

Operation of CCTV systems in Public Spaces, housing estates, council premises where the object is the prevention and detection of crime and community safety programmes.

Note. This purpose is designed to describe general crime prevention initiatives. More specific activities, for instance the investigation and prosecution of cases of benefit fraud are recorded under the relevant purposes.

Nottingham City Council and partners support the individual's right to privacy and will insist that all agencies involved in the provision and use of Public CCTV systems connected to the Nottingham City Council's CCTV Control Centre accept this fundamental principle as being paramount. Before cameras are placed in residential areas the residents in that area will be consulted concerning the proposed system. The results of the consultation will be considered as part of the completed Data Protection Privacy Impact Assessment (DPIA).

The public interest in the operation of the scheme will be recognised by ensuring the security and integrity of operational procedures.

The system will continue to be operated by trained and authorised personnel.

The scheme aims to provide surveillance of the public areas in order to fulfil the purposes of the scheme. The area protected by CCTV is indicated by the presence of signs. The signs are placed so that the public are aware that they are entering a zone, which is covered by surveillance equipment. The signs state the organisation responsible for the scheme, the purposes of the scheme and a contact telephone number. Data will not be held for longer than necessary and disposal of information will be regulated.

The scheme is registered with the Information Commissioner. The registration number is **Z5833067**. The scheme will be managed in accordance with the principles of the Data Protection Act 1998, Human Rights Act 1998, and all other relevant legislation. Reviews of Data Protection and Legal Requirements are taken annually.

Includes use of closed-circuit television for the monitoring and collection of visual images for the purpose of maintaining the security of premises, for preventing crime and investigating crime.

The Operation:

In 2023, across the Nottingham City boundary (divided in this report into the localities of Central, North & South), 303 fully functional CCTV cameras were monitored by Nottingham Control Centre 24 hours a day 365 days a year by trained staff who have been screened in accordance with British Standard 7858 and NPPV Level 2.

All employees engaged in the monitoring and operation of CCTV have received training to the standards required by the Private Security Industry Act 2001. As a further requirement of the above Act all operators are licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).

In addition to the live feed cameras, the CCTV scheme has a stock of 14 redeployable cameras. These are placed in areas identified as having high levels of Anti-Social Behaviour. During 2024, 17 reactive viewings took place of these 4G style cameras, of which 16 of these viewings were taken as footage. Management of these cameras and their placement is through a partnership forum; attendees include police, street scene, and community protection. The impact of these cameras is very direct in that they often disperse the crime from the original area of concern.

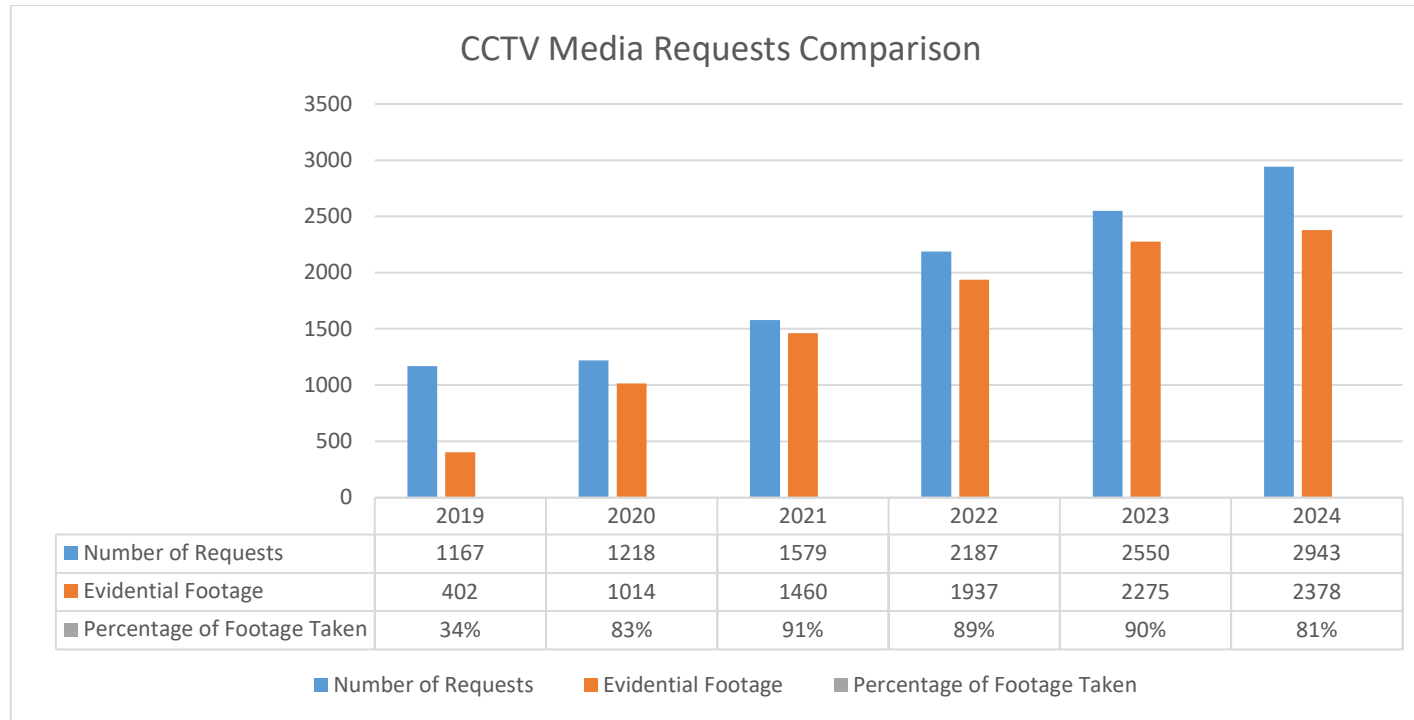
During 2024, there were No Data Protection Impact Assessments completed to support the installation of the CCTV cameras.

REVIEWS UNDERTAKEN BY POLICE AND EXTERNAL AGENCIES

In total the Control centre had 2943 viewings of which 2378 of these resulting in footage being taken as evidence. The highest proportion of viewing requests are related to 'Crime - Violence Against Person' & 'Crime Society' related incidents.

We utilise Cryptshare and NICE to securely send over most of the CCTV footage requests. Of which, 81% of CCTV Footage is requested by the Police & Partner Agencies. Since the introduction of encrypted transfer files, which are sent electronically, evidential footage has increased twofold.

The Control Centre processed 2 Subject Access requests on the systems that is monitored within the CCTV Control Centre.



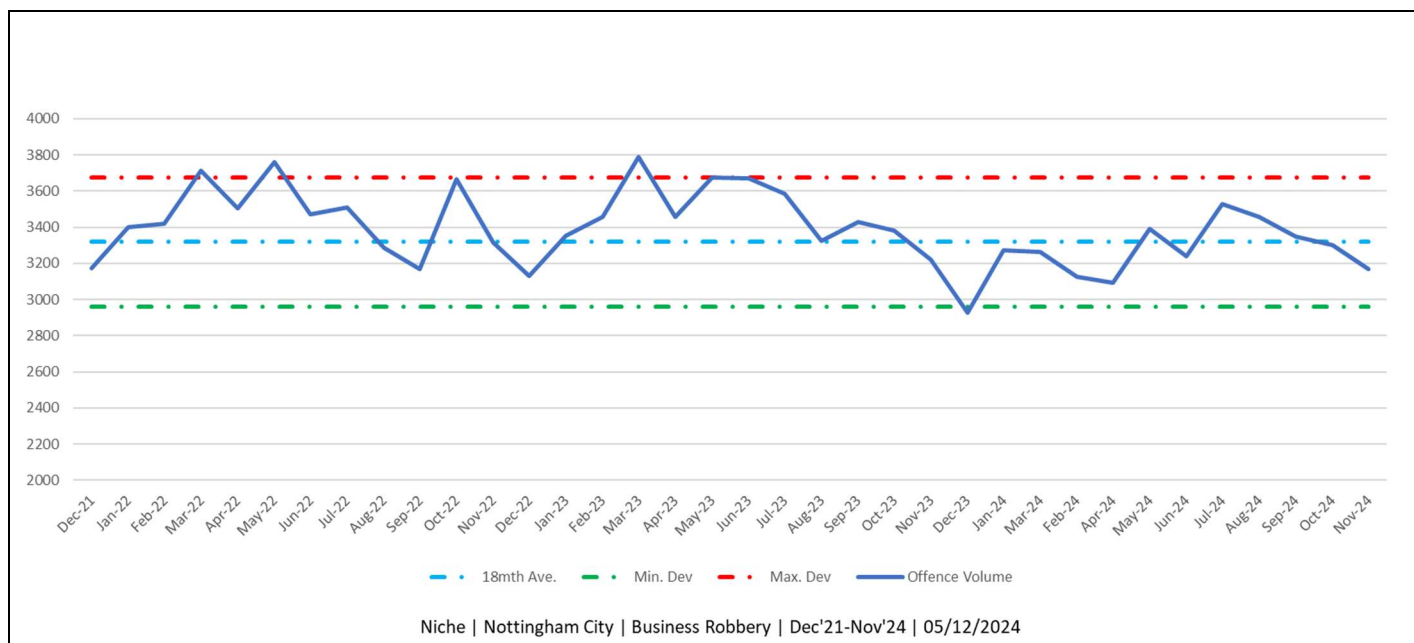

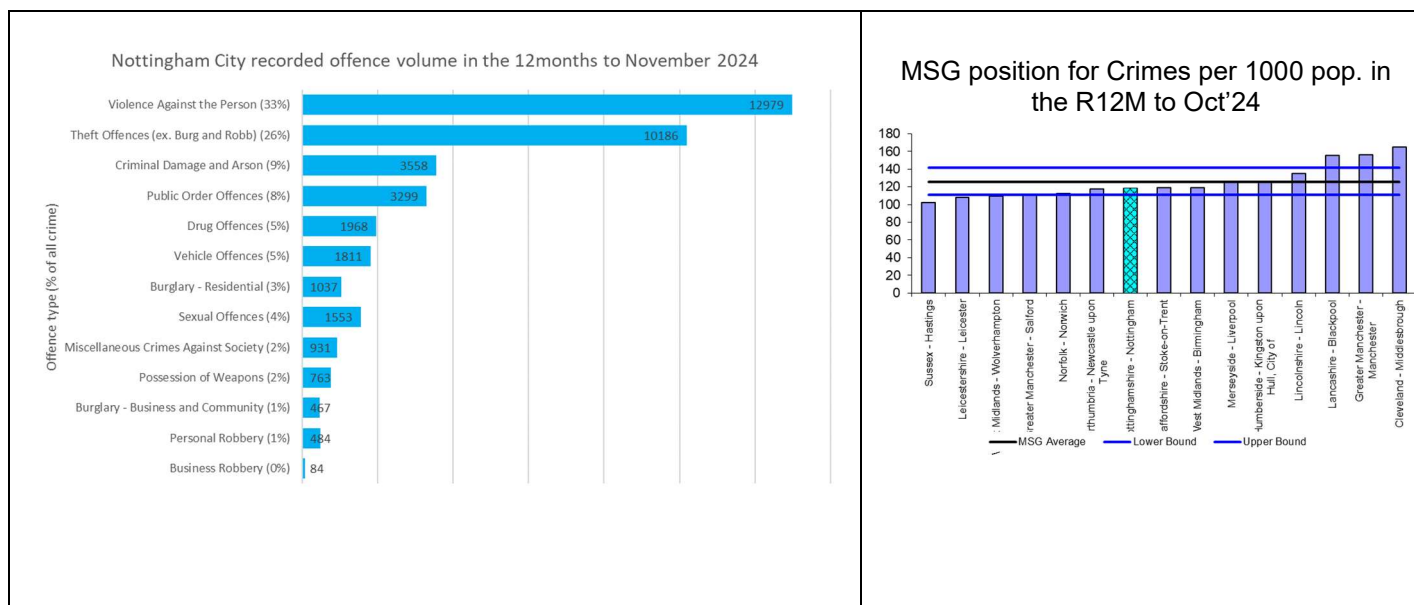
All Crime

Key points:

- Offences levels saw a long-term decrease of 5.5% and a medium-term decrease of 5.7%.
- VAP and Theft Offences (ex. Burg and Robb) represent most offences, 33% & 26% respectively.
- There was no change in Nottingham's position for offence levels across the Most Similar Group (MSG).
- Medium-term positive outcomes reduced by two percentage points.

Performance Overview

Long term performance in 2023/24 saw a 5.5% decrease (2,27 fewer offences), when compared to the 2021/22 assessment period. The medium term saw a further decrease of 5.7% (2,352 fewer offences), when compared to 2022/23. In the short term there was a decrease of 2% (205 fewer offences) between September and November 2024, when compared to the same period in 2023. In the 2016/17 period Nottingham City saw a change in the highest volume offence type with Violence Against the Person (VAP) replacing Theft Offences as the primary crime category. This came about with changes in the recording rules whereby stalking & harrasment crimes became VAP crimes. Both categories remain the most recorded offence categories in 2023/24 with VAP offences accounting for 33% of offences and Theft Offences accounting for 26% of records.

Long Term Performance

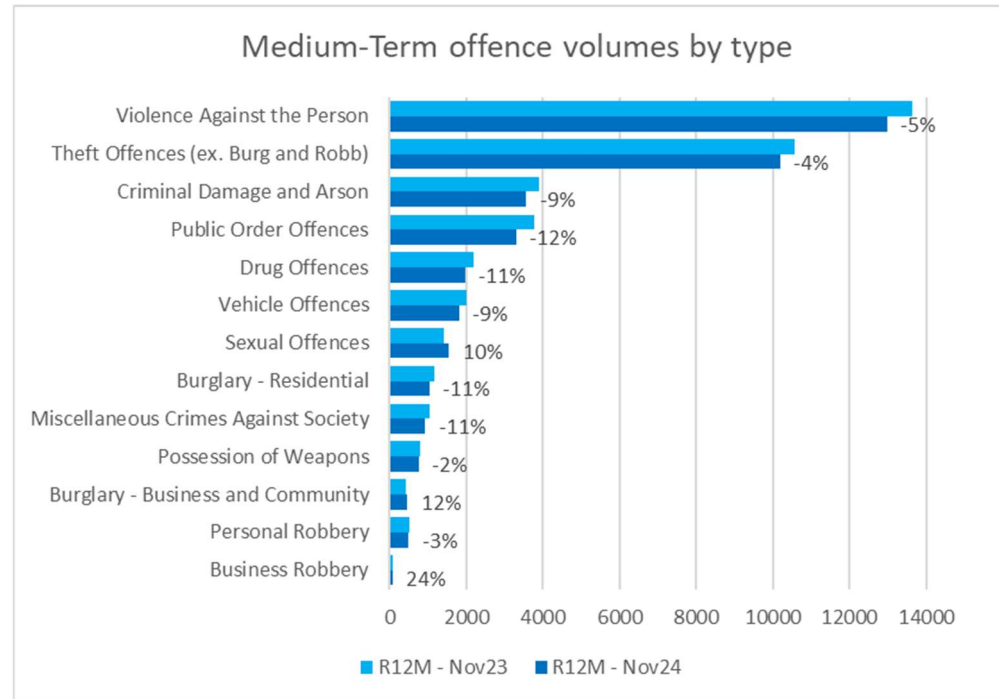
Between December 2021 and November 2024, a total of 121,988 offences were recorded by Nottinghamshire Police in Nottingham City. The long-term comparison between Dec21-Nov22 and Dec23-Nov24 shows a 5.5% decrease in offences.

Medium Term Performance

Despite lockdowns being a national policy, Nottingham City's rate of offending per 1000 of population saw impressive positive moves within the Most Similar Group (MSG) of cities. Nottingham's position for offences within the MSG had improved from ninth **best** (with 117.6 crimes per 1000 pop.) in 2019/20, to seventh **best** (with 129.3 crimes per 1000 pop.) in 2022-23. Since then, despite volume decreases, the city's position has remained at seventh **best** (with 118.37 crimes per 1000 pop.), in the R12M to October 2024.

December 2023 to November 2024 figures show a decrease of 5.7% (2,352 fewer offences) compared to the same period in 2022/23. VAP offences experienced a 5% decrease in volume despite being the largest volume offence in the past 12 months, Theft Other (ex. Burg and Robb), saw 3.6% fewer crimes. Since the bulk of this offence group is attributed to Shoplifting (55%, 5,615 offences), it is not surprising that, as predicted in the Strategic Assessment 2021, once retail outlets re-opened without restrictions there has been year on year increases in recorded Shoplifting offences with a medium term increase of 2.2% or 122 more offences.

Violence Against the Person

VAP offences represent 33% of recorded offences in the twelve months to November 2024 with increasing volumes in the VAP offence types of Homicide (+20%, 1 more offence), Death or Serious Injury - Unlawful Driving (+33%, 2 more offences) and Violence with injury (+9%, 393 more offences).

Over the three years covered by this assessment the volume of VAP offences recorded as occurring in a dwelling have consistently accounted for more than half of offences, with 54% in 2021-22, 55% in 2022-23 and 53% in 2023-24. This compares with the next largest recorded VAP offence location of Public/Open Space which accounted for 25% in 2021-22, 24% in 2022-23 and 25% in 2023-24.

The volume of VAP offences recorded within a dwelling decreased in both the long and medium-terms with 726 fewer and 611 fewer offences recorded respectively.

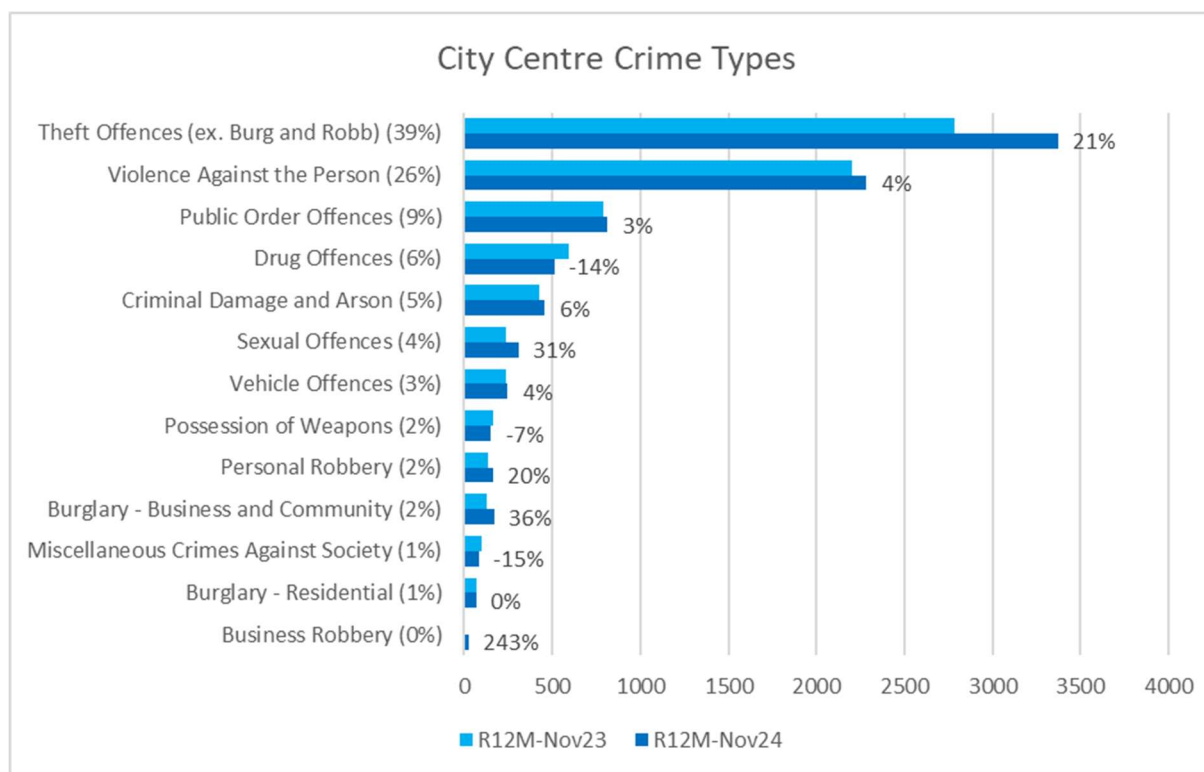
Most Serious Violence categories saw a long-term offence decrease of 7% (1,165 fewer offences) and a further decrease of 4% (628 fewer offences) in the medium-term. The medium term reduction was hindered by an increase in Assault With Injury offences of 9% or 393 more offences.

The city centre continues to see the largest volume of crime in the twelve months to November 2024, whilst outside of the City Centre the Hyson Green & Arboretum ward has the largest volume. The largest volume increase over the previous period was seen in the Bulwell ward with a 17% increase (392 more offences) when compared with 2022/23. These trends are shown in the following table. Highlighted are the wards with the largest volume totals and increases outside of the City Centre.

The City centre offences volume increased by 10% when compared with the R12M to Nov'23. Theft offences increased by 21% over the previous period and accounted for 39% of the City's offences, with 55% of these being Shoplifting offences, which experienced a 53% increase of offences.



Offences with a positive outcome between December 2023 to November 2024 accounted for 9% of outcomes which is a two-percentage point drop from the 11% recorded in the same period in December 2022 to November 2023. This difference could be attributed to the increased time for previous offences to be processed when compared to latest offences.

Short Term Performance

Comparing the three months of September to November 2024 with the same period on 2023 saw an offence volume decrease of 2% or 205 fewer offences. This decreasing volume are 3.2% (325 fewer offences), less than the levels recorded in the same period in 2022.

The highest volume offence type in this period was VAP with 3,052 offences, which was an 8% decrease or 274 fewer offences when compared to the same period in 2023. Sexual offences volume increased in the current period and in the short-term is the largest volume increase offence type with 41 more offences than the last period which is an 10% increase. Of these offences, rape offences experienced a 6% increase or 35 more offences.

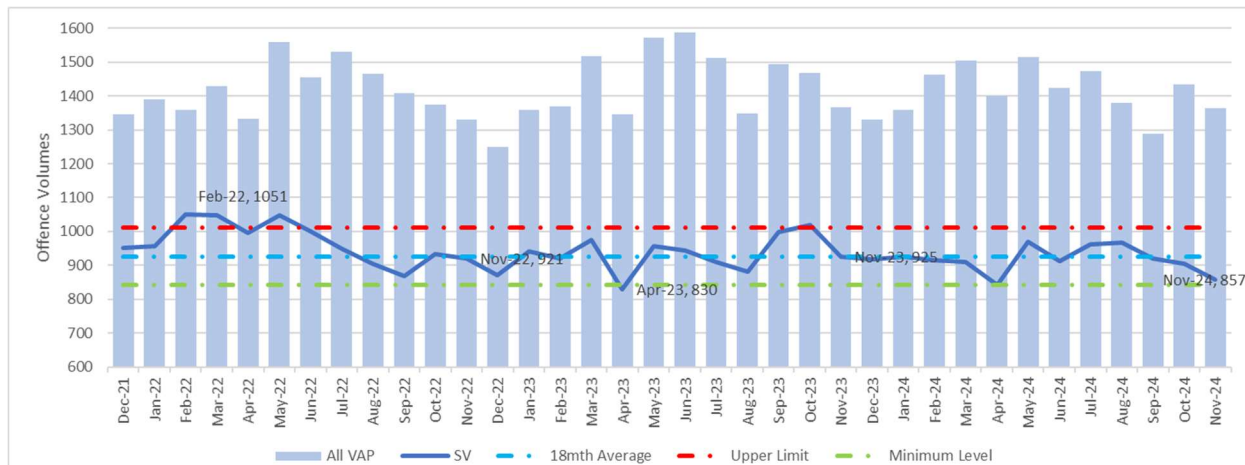
The City Centre experienced the largest offence volume with 2,279 offences in the short-term (the largest percentage being Shoplifting with 22%), this was 191 more offences than last year and the largest offence volume increase when compared to the same three months in 2023.

Serious Violence Crime

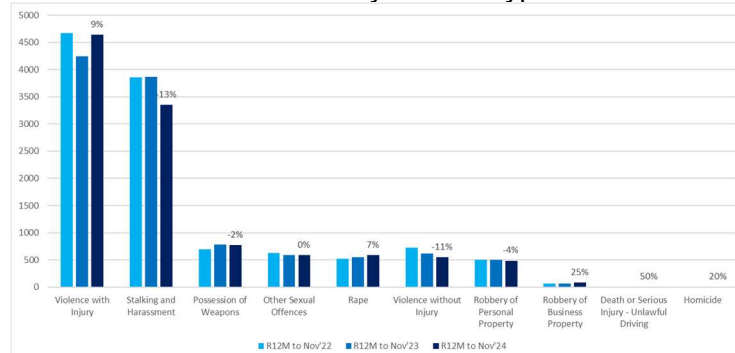

SV by offence type

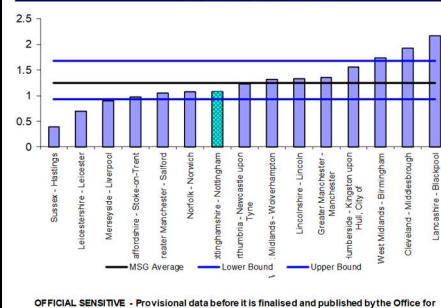


iQuanta Bar Chart MSG (12 months) - Crimes per 1000 Residents

Performance Overview

The long-term performance in 2023/24 saw a 5.4% decrease (625 fewer offences), when compared to the 2021/22 assessment period. The medium-term saw a decrease of 1.5% (168 fewer offences), when compared to 2022/23. In the short-term there was a decrease of 9% (259 fewer offences) between December and November 2024, when compared to the same period in 2023.

Long Term Performance

Between December 2021 and November 2024, a total of 33,802 offences were recorded by Nottinghamshire Police in Nottingham City. The long-term comparison between Dec21-Nov22 and Dec23-Nov24 shows an 5.4% decrease in offences.























Medium Term Performance

For the purposes of this report there are eight level 3 monitored offence types categorised as serious violence as follows: Death or Serious Injury - Unlawful Driving, Homicide, Sexual Assault Offences, Rape, Robbery of Business & Personal Property, Possession of Weapons, and Violence with injury.

The VAP crime flow chart on the dashboard shows the monthly volume and trend of VAP offences which encompasses Stalking & Harassment and Violence with and without violence. SV offences volumes are tracked over these basic VAP offences.

Overall, the volume of SV crimes has decreased, such that the average monthly volume of offences decreased to 927 per month over the last 18 months to November 2024 from 931 offences in the 18 months to November 2023. This decreasing trend looks set to continue since the average over the last 12 months is 917 offences per month.

The City Centre experienced the largest volume of SV crime in the twelve months to November 2024 and the largest volume increase of 165 more offences than in the previous period. Berridge saw the largest medium-term increase outside of the City Centre when compared to the previous period with 78 more offences (+15%).

The positive outcome rate for SV offences in 2023/24 was 12%, decreasing from 15% in 2022/23. There were 1308 SV offences with the outcome of charged, 14% of all outcomes for this offence type. The rate of outcomes recorded as, Victim declines/withdraws support - named suspect identified was 34%, increasing from 32% in the previous period.

VAP crime victims identifying the offender as a stranger in 26% of records, while 9% identified the offender as an acquaintance and 6% identified the offender as a spouse or partner. While SV crime victims identifying the offender as a stranger in 20% of records, while 9% identified the offender as an acquaintance and 13% identified the offender as a spouse or partner.

SV Victim gender and ethnicity analysis indicates that the rate of repeat victimisation for Asian and White females is greater than any other ethnic group, while the rate among men is led by Mixed race victims. There is a lack of ethnicity details for male and female victims with 31% and 32% respectively being recorded as “Not Stated”.

Short Term Performance

Comparing the three months of September to November 2024 with the same period on 2023 saw an VAP offence volume decrease of 8% or 274 fewer offences and an SV offences volume decrease of 9% or 259 fewer offences. There was also a VAP decrease of

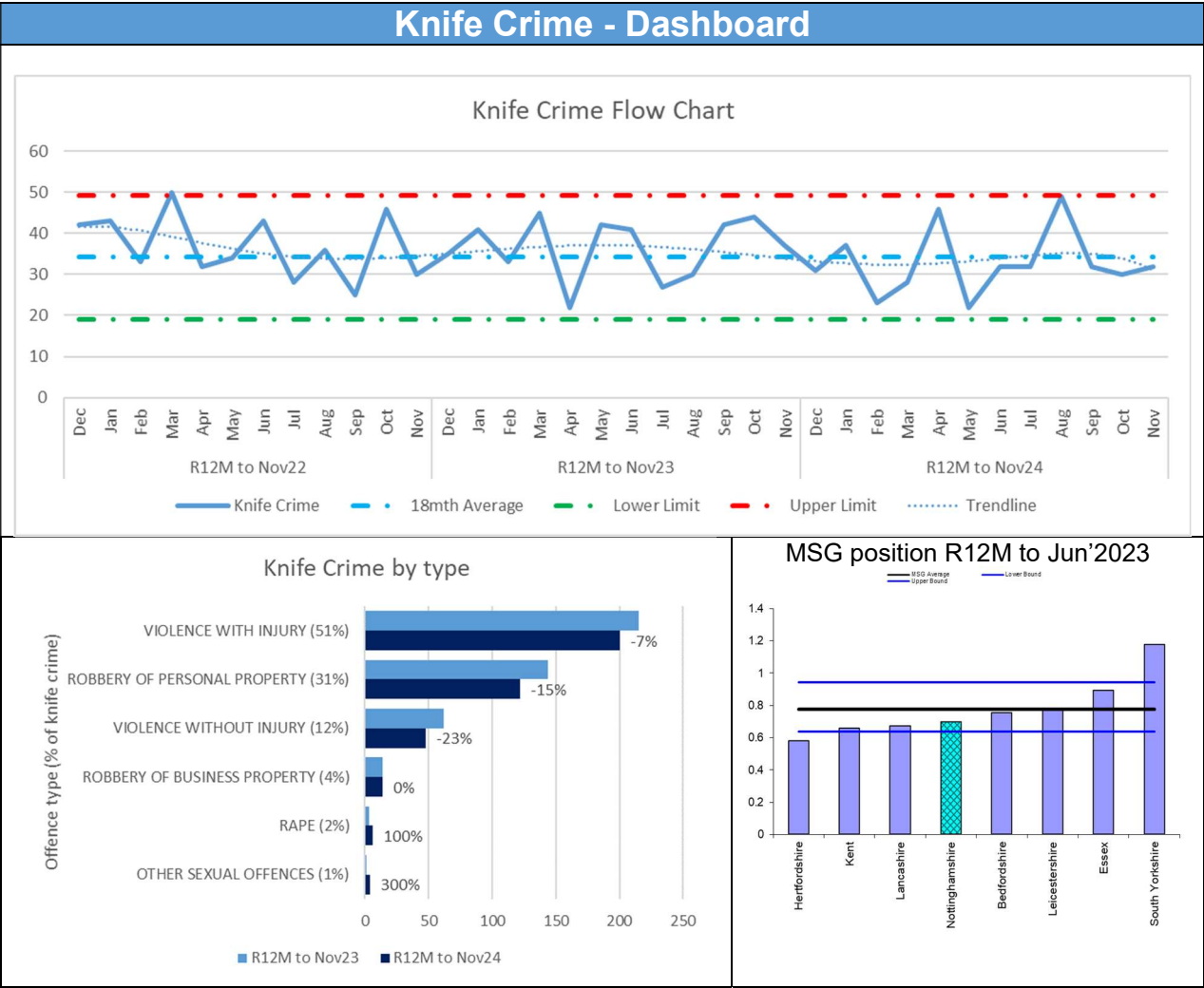
3% (325 fewer offences) and an SV decrease of 2% or 41 fewer offences, compared with in the same period in 2022. The highest volume VAP offence type in this period was violence without injury with 1202 offences, which was a 1% decrease or 10 fewer offences when compared to the same period in 2023.

The City Centre experienced the largest VAP offence volume with 557 offences in the short-term which was 12 fewer offences than last year, while the largest offence volume increase of 19 more offences when compared to the same three months in 2023 was seen in Bulwell Forest.

Knife Crime

Key points:

- There are long-term and medium-term offence level decreases of 11% and 10% respectively.
 - Violence with injury and Personal Robbery represent most offences, 51% & 31% respectively.
 - Nottinghamshire's last reported position for offence levels across the Most Similar Group (MSG) is the fourth best.
 - Medium-term positive outcomes reduced by four percentage points.

Performance Overview

The long-term performance in 2023/24 saw a 11% decrease (48 fewer offences), when compared to the 2021/22 assessment period. The medium-term saw a decrease of 10% (45 fewer offences), when compared to 2022/23. In the short-term there was a decrease of 24% (29 fewer offences) between December and November 2024, when compared to the same period in 2023.

Long Term Performance

Between December 2021 and November 2024, a total of 1275 offences were recorded by Nottinghamshire Police in Nottingham City. The long-term comparison between Dec21-Nov22 and Dec23-Nov24 shows an 11% decrease in offences.

Medium Term Performance

There are five key crime types that make up knife crime offences – rape, robbery personal property, robbery of business property, violence with injury and violence without injury.

The knife crime flow chart on the dashboard shows the monthly volume and trend of knife offences. Overall, the volume of knife crimes has decreased, such that the average monthly volume of offences decreased to 34.2 per month over the last 18 months to November 2024 from 35.9 offences in the 18 months to November 2023. This decreasing trend looks set to continue since the average over the last 12 months is 32.8 offences per month.

The City Centre experienced the largest volume of knife crime in the twelve months to November 2024 despite a 3% decrease or 2 fewer offences than in the previous period. Bilborough saw the largest medium-term increase when compared to the previous period with 9 more offences (+53%).

The positive outcome rate for Knife offences in 2023/24 was 14%, decreasing from 18% in 2022/23. There were 52 knife offences with the outcome of charged, 13% of all outcomes for this offence type. The number of outcomes recorded as, Victim declines/withdraws support - named suspect identified was 32%, increasing from 31% in the previous period.

The Aims and Objectives for the Next 12 Months:

Work continues to have a fully integrated physical security information management system (PSIMS), which will give greater efficiency and savings as the system allows the operation for Public Space CCTV monitoring, Concierge, car parking operations and alarm handling all from one workstation.

We have submitted a plan to the Council to set up a replacement programme for our ageing stock which will over a rolling 12-month period resulting in 10% of our stock being replaced with newer IP cameras as we move away from analogue. The advantages of IP are clear to see giving higher video quality than analogue cameras and offer more video site range, such as wide or narrow field of view and better zoom in quality.

We have installed a new network around the Clifton area of Nottingham. Resulting in 6 new IP type cameras operating in this area. We are now extending this to cover Bulwell and Broxtowe within the next 12 months. (*Aim to Complete in March 2026*).

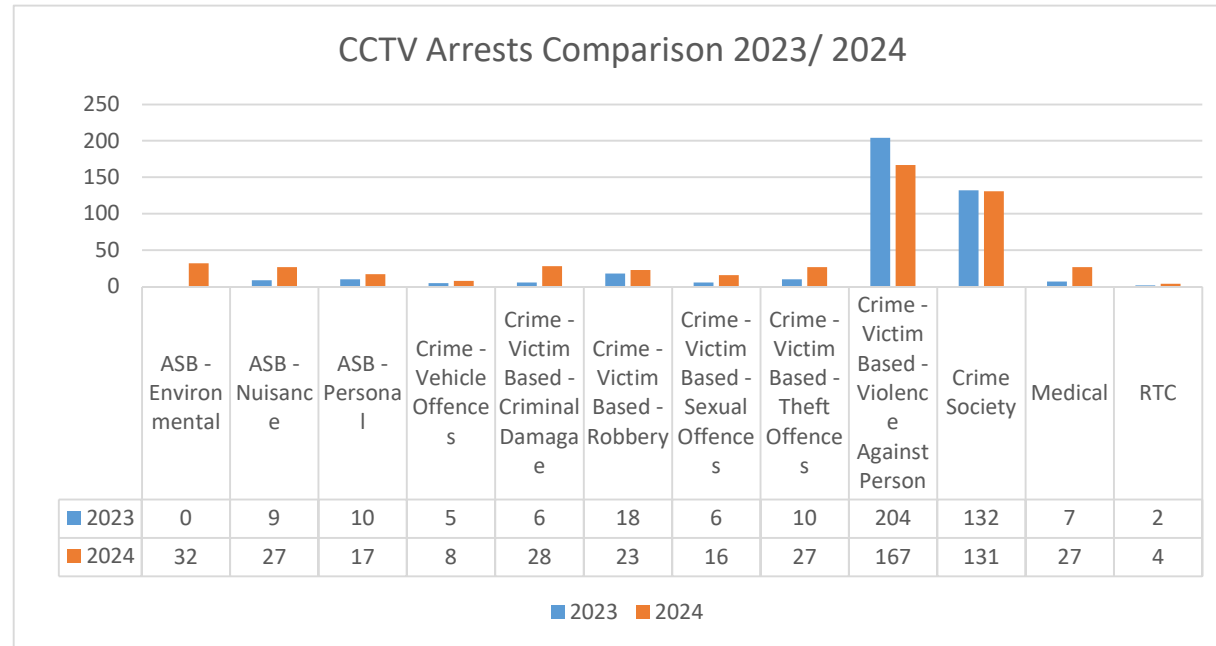
Working with the Police Crime Commissioner (PCC) Safer Street Funding are looking to increase CCTV Cameras specifically within the Clifton and Bulwell area.

We have submitted a plan to the Council to set up a replacement programme for our ageing stock which will over a rolling 12-month period resulting in 10% of our stock being replaced with newer IP cameras as we move away from analogue. The advantages of IP are clear to see giving higher video quality than analogue cameras and offer more video site range, such as wide or narrow field of view and better zoom in quality.

We are working with internal and external partners to introduce new help points within the Wards, which will be an identical set up to the help points equipment that has been installed within the Forest Recreational Ground. We are looking to expand within the Radford ward to increase public safety and deter ASB and Crime within a hotspot area.
