What Do I Need To Know?

The term highway and a public right of way mean the same thing - they are both a 'way' over which the public have a right to pass and repass at all times. A highway includes all roads, pavements, footpaths, bridleways and byways. If your work or development affects a highway, before you start you need to contact us to get the correct legal orders, licences and/or agreements in place.



What Consents Do I Need?

- Licence to carry out temporary activities on the highway: including placing skips, scaffolding, hoarding, fencing, materials on the highway. For advice email: highway.management@nottinghamcity.gov.uk
- Temporary Traffic Regulation Order: temporarily restricts public use (walking, cycling and driving) over a highway during construction. For advice email: highway.management@nottinghamcity.gov.uk
- Permanent Traffic Regulation Order:
 used to permanently change how the public use the highway, including new
 residents parking schemes or bays.

- Stopping Up and Diversion Order:
 To carry out development on a highway, the highway must first be stopped up (permanently closed) or diverted onto a new alignment.

- Section 278/38 Agreement:
 A Section 278 is an agreement with the Council to carry out work on an existing highway. A Section 38 Agreement covers building new highways and future maintenance. For advice email: highway.agreements@nottinghamcity.gov.uk
- Road Safety Audit:
 Any alterations to the highway layout need assessing by Road Safety and may require a Road Safety Audit.
