## Read me now – Urgent and important information

#### Request for Schools to update their position on Wraparound Childcare

On 30<sup>th</sup> January we contacted all schools to request an update on their current position regarding wraparound childcare, before and after school, for primary school aged children. This is to support our revised Delivery Plan for the coming year, focusing support where it is most needed and assessing interest in forthcoming funding applications whilst there is funding to support this agenda. If you've not done so already, please reply by **14<sup>th</sup> February 2025**.

## **Disability Access Funding (DAF)**

Claims for eligible children from 9 months to 4 years in receipt of any early years entitlement place and claiming Disability Living Allowance (DLA) will need to be applied for before **Thursday 28th February 2025**. Any payments received after this date will be processed at the end of April 2025, in the new financial year.

#### EYPDP Update

As the Early Years Professional Development Programme comes to a close, we wanted to take this opportunity to remind participating practitioners that access to the Learning Platform will officially end shortly, with learning materials no longer being accessible. For Cohort 3 the official end date is Monday 10<sup>th</sup> February and for Cohort 4, Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> February.

## Package of Early Years Qualification Initiatives

DfE have announced a package of early years qualification initiatives that will both support entry and progression within the workforce and ensure that the staff working with young children have the right skills and knowledge to deliver high-quality provision. To support early years settings to recruit and retain staff, from 3 March 2025, eligible educators will be able to access an <u>experience-based route</u>. This is an opportunity for educators without currently approved qualifications, to develop their careers, and for providers to maximise the potential of their talented staff in a way that works best for the children in their care. In addition, there is the publication of the <u>Early Years Teacher</u> <u>Degree Apprenticeship standard</u>. This is a new, graduate-level qualification that will give everyone, from school leavers and junior staff to senior leaders, the opportunity to easily move into a specialist career in the early years sector. Later in Spring, there are also plans to introduce the Check an Early Years Qualification digital service which will guide managers through the process of checking the approval status of qualifications held by existing staff members and prospective employees, increasing their confidence that they have appropriately qualified staff.

## **Consultation Feedback and Business Meetings**

Our consultation on the funding rates for the early years entitlements for 2025/26 closed on 31st January 2025. Feedback from the consultation and confirmation of the 2025/26 hourly rates, will be shared with early years providers in the PVI sector at the <u>Annual Business Meeting</u> on 6th February 2025 and with schools and academies at the <u>Early Years Funding Briefing for Headteachers and Business Managers</u> on 11th February 2025.
