Nottingham City Council is committed to sound asset management of highway infrastructure for the benefit of current and future generations. It recognises that asset management principles enable informed decisions to be made for:

- funding infrastructure asset improvements and maintenance
- cost effective targeting to achieve the greatest benefit
- improved risk management in order to help deliver the best long-term outcomes for local communities.

The Council will achieve these by developing a Highway Infrastructure Asset Management Strategy that:

- makes informed decisions based on accurate, complete and current data
- defines levels of service for highway assets
- takes a life-cycle approach to planning investment and management decisions
- uses risk to balance competing needs across the highway network to meet the optimal outcomes
- monitors, evaluates and, where necessary, improves service delivery
- adopts a continuous improvement approach to:
  - o asset management
  - o infrastructure maintenance policies and practices

The Council will prioritise the infrastructure assets that are most important to the City's growth, whilst recognising the importance of a well-maintained and safe road network for communities.
