E.ON's commitments to inclusion and diversity

At E.ON, we're committed to offering an inclusive culture, where everyone can be themselves at work, feel valued and can achieve their full potential and this year this has been more important than ever, with colleagues having to adapt to new ways of working in a challenging environment.

E.ON supports this commitment in its broadest sense, promoting inclusion across all diversity strands, throughout every level of the organisation.

- E.ON has been recognised as one of the UK's top inclusive employers for the fourth year running
 as part of <u>The Inclusive Top 50 UK Employers List in 2020</u>, improving our ranking year on year to
 now be 23rd and the only energy company listed
- To demonstrate this commitment E.ON is signatory of the Race at Work Charter, the Armed
 Forces Covenant and the Care Leavers Covenant. E.ON has also joined the POWERful Women's
 Energy Leaders' Coalition, along with other organisations from across the energy sector aiming to
 improve gender diversity and inclusion within their own organisations and across the UK energy
 sector as a whole
- Colleagues and leaders actively support and drive inclusion through inclusion networks which are
 open to everyone and support racial inclusion, gender equality, disability and carers, LGBT+,
 menopause, religion and belief, working families and mental health. Over 1700 colleagues are
 part of these networks.
- To support colleagues with disabilities E.ON partners the Business Disability Forum, who provide
 practical tools and advice, are a level 2 Disability Confident Employer and also partner the
 Dyslexia Society to actively enable neurodiverse colleagues to be their best at work
- In 2020 E.ON achieved Gold in the Mind Workplace Wellbeing Index
- In recognition of the socio-economic challenges in further education degree apprenticeships were introduced in 2019, offering a university degree and paid employment
- Colleagues are also able to build skills through apprenticeships with over 300 colleagues currently on an apprenticeship. In July E.ON was rated 25th in the Rate My Apprenticeship awards.
