## Privacy Notice for Static Camera Penalty Charge Notices (PCNs)

We will use your information as the registered keeper of the vehicle for the issue of a PCN for a camera contravention. The information will be used to process your payments for such PCNs, and to process any appeal representations you may make. If a static PCN is not paid or challenged within the discount period, your details will be shared with the DVLA who then provide us with necessary information to pursue the PCN with you. The basis under which the Council uses personal data for this purpose is that this is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the Council or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Council.

You are not obliged by statute or contract to provide the information requested in the PCN appeal form, but you will need to provide the information in order to make PCN challenges and representations. All your information regarding your static PCN will be kept for 6 years.

The information provided by you may also be used for the purpose of any other function carried out by the Council. The new data protection law known as the General Data Protection Regulation provides for the following rights as prescribed by the legislation:

- A right to request a copy of your information
- A right to request rectification of inaccurate personal data
- A right to request erasure of your data known as 'the right to be forgotten'
- A right to in certain circumstances to request restriction of processing

- A right in certain circumstances to request portability of your data to another provider
- A right to object to processing of data in certain circumstances
- A right regarding automated decision making including profiling
