

When contacting the Planning Policy & Research Team we will use the information provided by you in connection with the development of the statutory development plan for Nottingham City and associated documents or to provide planning policy advice on development sites or planning applications. The basis under which the Council uses personal data for this purpose is that this is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest by the Council or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Council.

You are not obliged, either by statute or by contract, to provide the information that is requested here but if you choose to input into the plan your information will be retained in connection with the development of the statutory plan. Any contact details collected for the purposes of statutory consultation will be held in a joint Greater Nottingham consultation database as well as any joint consultation responses. However any consultation responses relating to Nottingham City Council specific planning policy documents will be held separately by Nottingham City Council

The new data protection law known as the General Data Protection Regulation provides for the following rights as prescribed by the legislation:

- A right to request a copy of your information
- A right to request rectification of inaccurate personal data
- A right to request erasure of your data known as ‘the right to be forgotten’
- A right to in certain circumstances to request restriction of processing
- A right in certain circumstances to request portability of your data to another provider
- A right to object to processing of data in certain circumstances
- A right regarding automated decision making including profiling
