- East Midlands Library consortium partners (EMLIB), who are Derbyshire, Nottingham, Inspire (Nottinghamshire), Leicestershire and Rutland
- The Library Management System (LMS) supplier, Sirsi Dynix

Your personal data will be shared only for the purposes of providing library services. You are not obliged, either by statute or by contract, to provide the information that is requested here. The information you have provided will be kept for as long as you are a library member or if you do not use your membership for a period of three years.

The new data protection law known as the General Data Protection Regulation provides for the following rights as prescribed by the legislation:

- A right to request a copy of your information
- A right to request rectification of inaccurate personal data
- A right to request erasure of your data known as 'the right to be forgotten'
- A right to in certain circumstances to request restriction of processing
- A right in certain circumstances to request portability of your data to another provider
- A right to object to processing of data in certain circumstances
- A right regarding automated decision making including profiling
