



Changes in Circumstances

You are committing a criminal offence if you do not immediately tell us of a change in your circumstances. We need to see original proof of any changes that you tell us about.

If any of the details you have given us change, you must let us know immediately.

Any changes that may result in an increase in your Housing Benefit and/or Council Tax Reduction must be reported in writing within one calendar month of the change.

Do not rely on someone else to pass the information on. You must explain what has changed and the date of the change.

Examples of changes you must tell us about:

- · If you move.
- If you or your partner stop or start getting Income Support or Job Seeker's Allowance
- · If you or your partner go into hospital for more than six weeks
- · If you or your partner stop or start work
- · If you or your partner's wages go up or down
- · If you or your partner's occupational pension goes up or down
- · If you or your partner's savings change
- If a partner, or anyone else, moves in or out
- If you or your partner are going to be away from home for more than 1 month
- · If you receive any decision from the Home Office
- · If your rent changes
- · Any changes in payments you get from sub-tenants or boarders
- If you or your partner start or stop getting any state benefits, or if your benefit changes to a different benefit
- If someone you look after stops getting Attendance Allowance
- If any of your children leave school or leave home
- · If you have another child
- If someone living with you, who is aged 18 or over, starts or stops work
- · If the wages of someone living with you, who is aged 18 or over, go up or down
- If someone else living with you stops or starts getting Income Support or Job Seeker's Allowance
- If you or your partner's Working Tax Credit changed
- If you stop caring for someone and stop getting Invalid Care Allowance

What happens next?

- If we have all the information we need we will write to you telling you how much you will get and
 when it will start.
- Please check all the details to check if we have used the right information to work out your claim.
- If you disagree with any details please write to us straight away.
- If you are going to get Housing Benefit and/or Council Tax Reduction, it usually starts from the Monday after we receive your form unless an an intention to claim has been made and recorded. Please see
- front page of this claim form.
 If you have to pay Council Tax, the Council Tax Reduction will reduce your Council Tax and we will then send you a new Council Tax bill.
- If you are a Council tenant your Housing Benefit will be paid directly to your rent account.
- If you have not heard from us and are worried about paying your rent or Council tax, please get in touch with the benefit office on 915 4944.

What happens after my claim is processed?

Whilst you are receiving any Housing Benefit or Council Tax Reduction a visit to your home may be arranged to make sure we have all the correct information about your claim. This is to make sure that we are paying you the right amount of benefit.

It is your responsibility to inform us about any changes in circumstances as soon as they happen. If changes are not reported straight away it may result in a large overpayment that will have to be repaid. If the delay was found to be deliberate you could even be fined or prosecuted.
